STEP 1	 Contact Request to set up an initial consultation to learn more about our program. Consultations are available through phone call, virtually, or in person at our facility.
STEP 2	 Apply Apply online and submit a non-refundable registration fee of \$100. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis until all spaces are filled. When we reach full capacity, families are invited to join our waitlist.
STEP 3	 Enroll After applying, families will be notified regarding admission. Submit the enrollment fee of \$200 & biannual supply fee of \$200. Submit all required enrollment forms on start date.



Montessori is a **scientifically based education approach** that emphasizes independence, freedom within limits, and respect for a child's natural psychological, physical, and social development. This philosophy was developed by Italian physician and educator Dr. Maria Montessori.

Montessori education is based on the belief that all **children** are **unique individuals**, that they all have immense potential, that they want to learn and be busy. Therefore, the teacher needs to guide each child through the learning process by using materials that fit their specific needs and pace.

FREEDOM OF CHOICE

Learning and well-being are improved when children have a **sense of control over their lives**. Although Montessori programs impose definite limits on this freedom, children are free to make many more decisions than children in traditional classrooms: what to work on, how long to work on it, with whom to work with, and so on.

ORDER

Research in psychology has shown that order in the environment is very helpful in learning and development. Montessori classrooms are **prepared** and **organized**, both **physically** (in terms of lay-out) and **conceptually** (in terms of how the use of materials progresses).

INTEREST

Research has proven that when individuals learn with the goal of only doing well on a test, their learning is superficial and quickly forgotten. **Children learn better when they are interested in what they are learning.**

LEARNING FROM PEERS

Children in Montessori classrooms learn by **imitation models**, through peer tutoring and in collaboration with others. In mixed age classes, younger children learn from older ones by observing their work. Older children who are teaching younger children repeat and consolidate their knowledge and skills while obtaining social skills.

MOVEMENT

Our brains develop in a world in which we "move and do", not in a world in which we sit at desks. **Movement and cognition** are closely entwined. Montessori education, therefore, involves movement to enhance learning.

CONTEXT

Children in Montessori programs **learn largely by doing**, rather than instruction-based learning. Through hands on learning, rather than just hearing and writing, their understanding is based on the context of actions and objects.

TEACHER GUIDANCE

Montessori guides provide **freedom within limits**. They sensitively respond to children's needs, while maintaining high expectations. Guides carefully observe, assess, and encourage children to reach their highest potential.



Tuition is based on the academic year August 2025 to May of 2026.

Tuition payment options are available as **one annual payment** or **10 monthly payments.** Our summer program is optional. Monthly tuition remains the same during the summer.

Families have the option of providing lunch from home or order catered lunches from Chappy's. Snack is provided daily by AMS.
